

## Free Online Resources for Reading and Studying the Bible

If you are just getting started, don't overcomplicate it. The goal is to understand what you are reading and stay consistent. These resources will help you do both.

**BibleProject** – Getting the big picture. Clear, engaging videos that explain how the Bible works. Their “How to Read the Bible” series is one of the simplest ways to understand context, genres, and the overall story of Scripture. <https://bibleproject.com/>

**BibleGateway** – Consistent daily reading. An easy, no-barrier way to read the Bible. Look up any passage, compare translations, or follow a reading plan. This is one of the simplest tools for daily use. <https://www.biblegateway.com>

**Blue Letter Bible** – For bigger questions. A step deeper without being overwhelming. Offers commentaries, word studies, and original language tools. <https://www.blueletterbible.org/>

**Bible.org** - Straightforward teaching and articles that explain difficult passages. The NET Bible notes are especially helpful for understanding why verses are translated the way they are. <https://bible.org/>
